Rewilding **Birch Creek** With Wild Horses Eco-Development and Tourism

** A once in a lifetime opportunity to leave a life changing legacy for tomorrow**

- First major Rewilding project in the United States and with Wild Horses
- **Birch Creek** Valley in Idaho:
400,000 acres of grazing lands in a self contained valley
1,383 acres of prime land nestled between lush grazing lands with mountain vistas, and running springs, available for eco-development, and tourism.
Growing economic opportunities for depopulated and forgotten local counties
- Re-establishing Yellowstone's wildlife corridor will enable **Birch Creek's** historical migration patterns of wildlife to return to the Snake River Plain
Expanding wildlife corridors from the Yukon to Yellowstone National Park to the wilderness areas of central Idaho

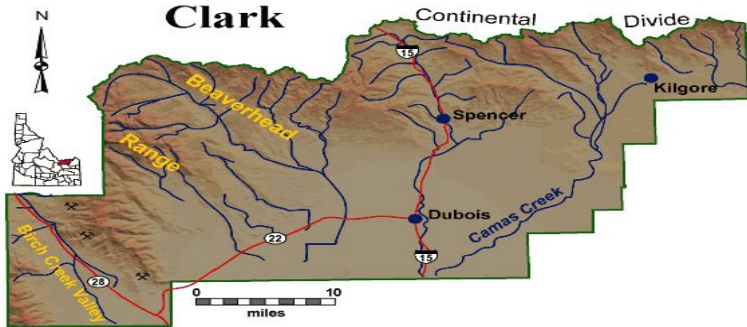

About Clark County Idaho, An opportunity to invest in.....

1. Clark County is home to 790 people, one of the least populated of Idaho's 44 counties
 2. Lying at the base of the continental divide and the Snake River plain
 3. A short 58 miles or 52 minutes from the Idaho Falls airport
 5. Birch Creek is the “rural” portion of Clark County Idaho, home to 8 people, 1 per 78 sq.miles
 6. Declining ranching ways of life have left these counties without opportunity to thrive

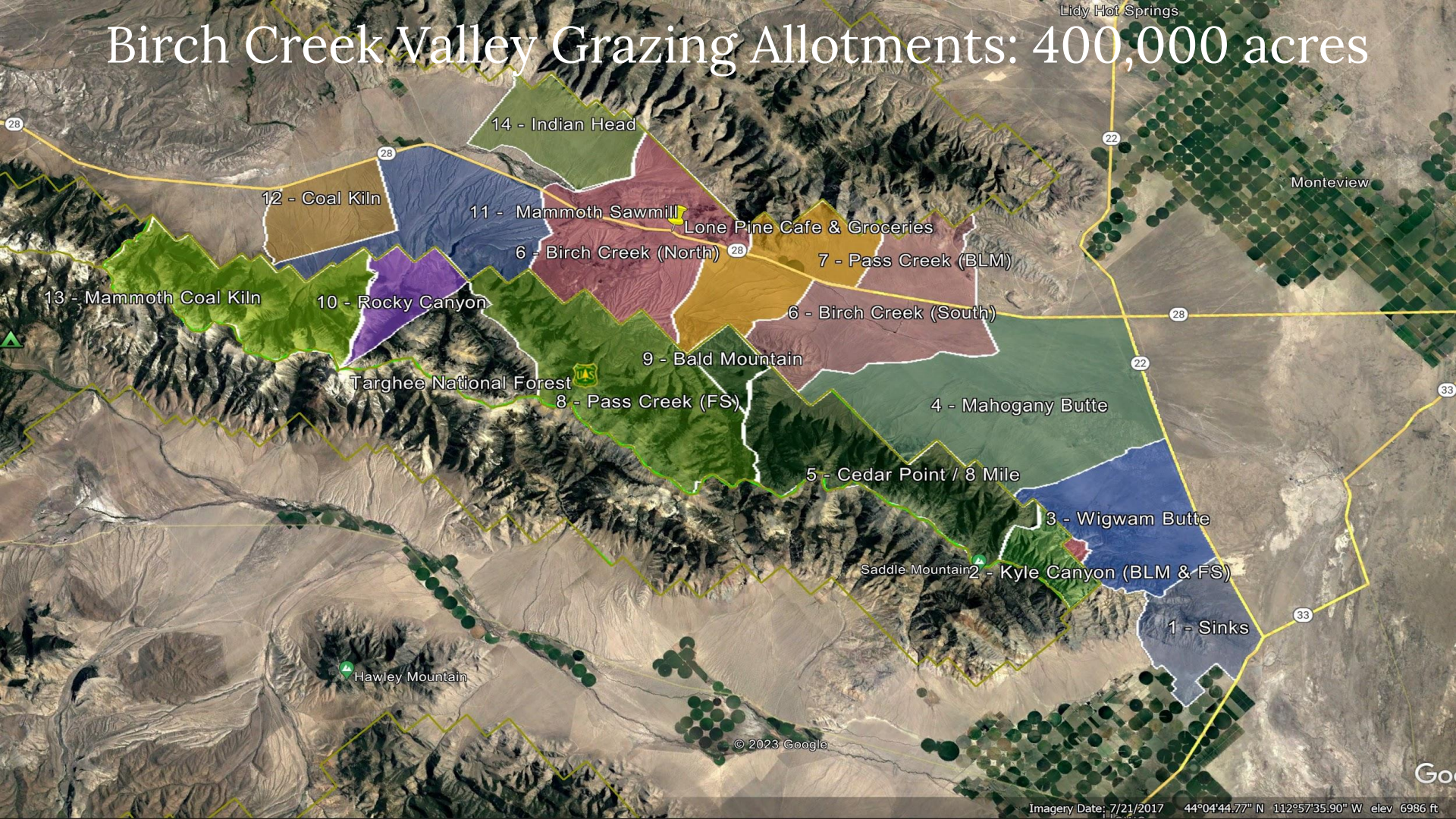

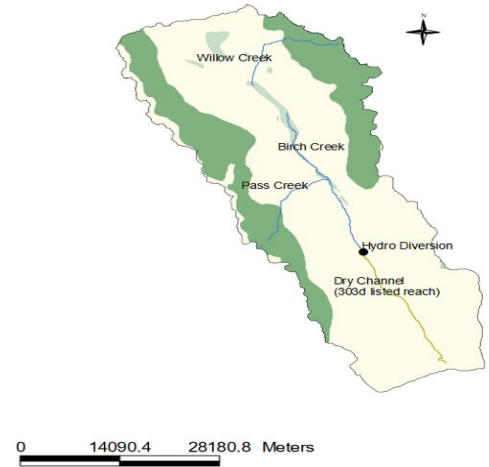
The Bitterroot/Beaverhead Mountains

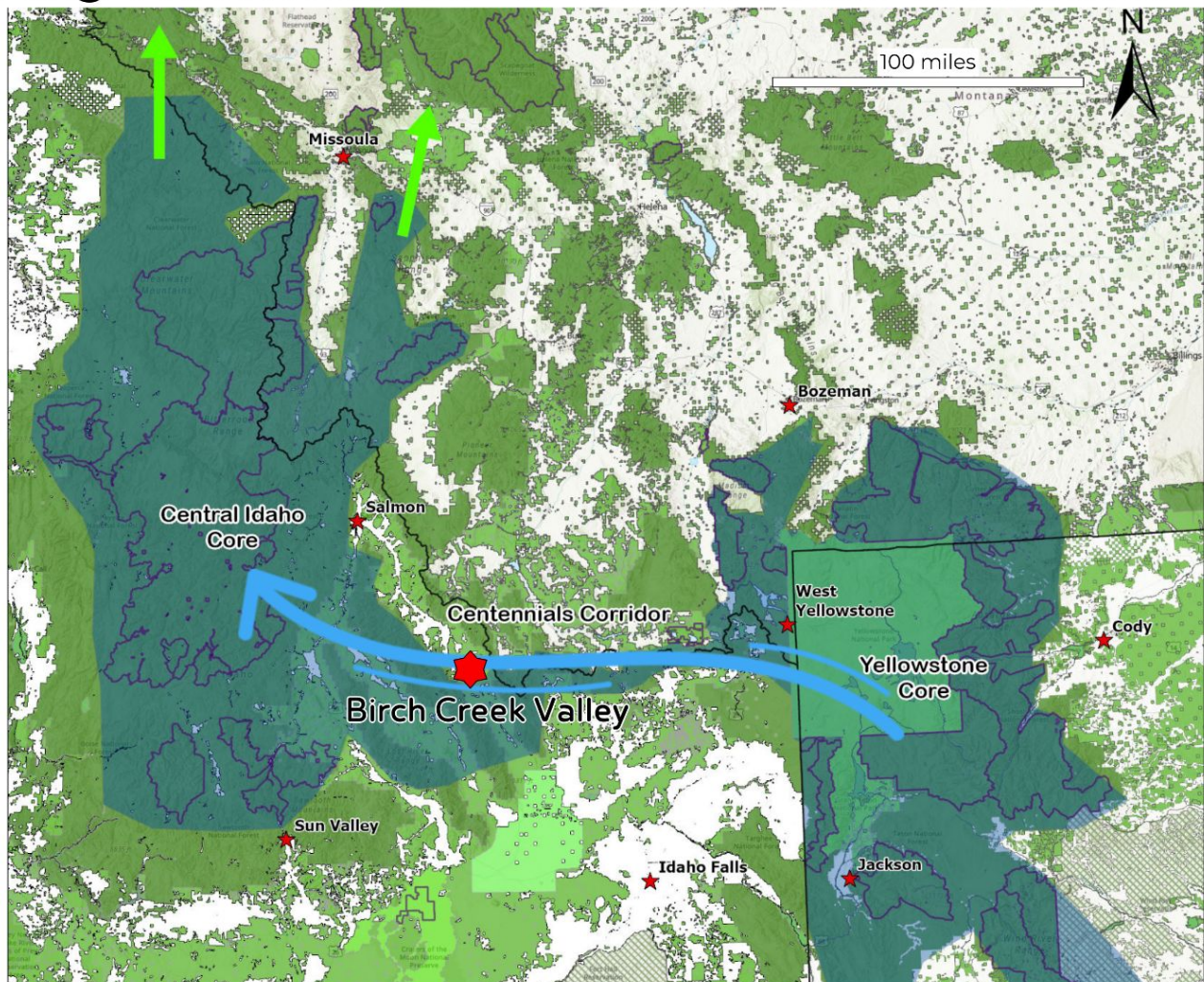
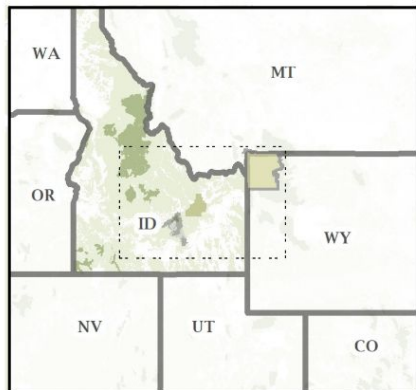

Silbernagel Ranch - Beaver Creek, ND

- Rewilding America Now is proud to be working and supporting the Silbernagels' unique methodology of rewilding through wild horses.
- Conserving their herd of Nokota Horses as well as Medicine Hat Horses, recently rescued from the BLM roundups in grassland ecology.
- These special horses hold significant cultural value among Native Americans.
- RAN is building educational programs that involve youth programs, researchers, ranchers and scientist studying the unique combination of wild horses, rotational crops & native prairie.
- RAN has put in place carbon research initiatives through free-roaming herds of these horses in native prairie habitat.
- Building a carbon market from wild horse grazing



Brownotter Ranch— Grand River SD

- Members of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe and Navajo Nation, the Brownotters founded the largest Native American-owned buffalo ranch in the U.S.
- Progressively restoring thousands of acres of native grassland with buffalo as free-roaming native herbivores, through traditional knowledge.
- Rewilding America Now has released a herd of wild horses rescued from the BLM roundups to be a part of this native grassland restoration.
- They will share pristine, native, and wildlife-rich prairie habitat with a band of native buffalo.
- RAN will be building scientific research and programs around this traditional knowledge and rewilding science.
